The Humboldt Trails Council serves as a unified voice to support development, maintenance, connection to and use of trails for recreation and transportation throughout Humboldt County.

The Humboldt Trails Council (HTC) consists of a ten-person volunteer board of directors, a dozen dedicated trail crew leaders, one phenomenal part-time staff member, over 200 trail volunteers, and a <u>whole lot</u> of community support for trail stewardship! *In the past year, HTC has accomplished the following:*

- The Volunteer Trail Stewards (VTS) program logged more than 7,208 hours of work on ten local trails. VTS maintains the trails, builds new trail segments, rehabilitates sections of trail, and keeps the trails clear of trash and graffiti. HTC has contractual agreements with Humboldt County, City of Eureka, City of Arcata, Bureau of Land Management, North Coast Regional Land Trust, and McKinleyville Land Trust to assist these organizations in developing and maintaining trails on their lands. HTC also has a contractual agreement with Redwood Invasive Plant Eradicators (RIPE) which focuses exclusively on removal of ivy as an invasive species. RIPE has been very active during 2024 and has addressed ivy removal at several locations.
- In August 2024, HTC held a volunteer recognition event to celebrate, recognize, and thank its VTS volunteers for their dedication to trail maintenance for the past 13 years!! The event was held at Redwood Park in Arcata and featured lots of food, games, and swag; various outdoor activities; speeches by local trail advocates; and prizes, prizes, and more prizes! It was attended by 72 volunteers, a great turnout! The HTC board members were very busy setting up the venue, cooking grilled foods, organizing games, giving away swag, and much more.

- Organized an in-person Trails Summit in 2024, highlighted by presentations from Senate Pro Tem Majority Leader Mike McGuire and Hank Seemann, Public Works Deputy-Director of Environmental Services, who presented updates on local trails with emphasis on the Humboldt Bay Trail and the McKay Community Forest. The summit also included a trail resource fair with organizations and agencies speaking to the public about new trails coming on-line in Humboldt County. - Attended numerous meetings and wrote countless letters to support trail development, advocated for safe transportation, collaborated with other trail organizations, and supported legislation promoting trail development.
- Advocated for and provided public input on the following trail projects:
 - Baduwa't portion of the Annie and Mary Trail connecting Blue Lake and Glendale
 - Sunset Interchange project in Arcata
 - Annie and Mary Connectivity Project trail from the Arcata Skate Park to the Water District Pump Station #1 Park on West End Road
 - Humboldt Bay Trail South
 - McKay Community Forest
 - Bay-to-Zoo Trail
 - City of Eureka Bike Plan
 - Eureka's Waterfront Area Plan
 - McKinleyville Community Forest
 - Rio Dell Eel River Trail
 - Eureka to CR Trail that will extend south from Humboldt Hill to College of the Redwoods
 - Great Redwood Trail
